Programme Manager Posting (London, UK)

The Programme Manager position is an exciting consultancy opportunity with a unique not-forprofit organization funded by The Rockefeller foundation, the Skoll Global Threats Fund, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and the Nuclear Threat Initiative.

This is a contract, remote-based position offering a flexible work arrangement and hours and the ideal candidate will be based in the London area. The Programme Manager will report to the Director of Strategy & Operations and will coordinate organization communications, both within CORDS and between its member networks, and oversee the progress of multiple high-level innovative research projects and programs.

Programmatic Responsibilities:

- Support the Director of Strategy & Operations in developing programs and workshops to build relationships and foster communication on risks between and within networks
- As directed, perform research and literature searches, preparing summaries as needed
- Develop concepts for sharing information globally on specific case study diseases or more general situations
- Participate in scheduled calls with various network personnel to discuss specific project developments, including regular focal group calls
- Delegate portions of workshop development, project development, and other items to personnel within the networks through appropriate granting or other oversight mechanisms
- Maintain communications with network personnel and oversee delegated projects to ensure their continued progress
- Take initiative in developing relationships between networks and CORDS HQ through means of phone, social media, web portal, in person, travel, field missions, etc.
- Develop social media content and issue updates on behalf of CORDS using various social media platforms and the CORDS website
- Perform network mapping and assist with impact measurement and evaluation

Administrative Responsibilities:

- Organize workshops/conferences, including monitoring budgets, arranging travel and location, and managing participation lists
- Correspond with workshop/conference participants and network liaisons regarding all relevant program details and administrative arrangements
- Assist with developing periodic narrative reports for funders
- Perform all other duties as assigned

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- Master's degree in Public Health, Communication, Social Sciences, Medical Sciences or related field is preferred
- Three to five years of experience as a communications specialist in the biomedical field or in public health is preferred
- Experience working on multinational and interdisciplinary teams
- Knowledge and experience with project management and program administration, including budget management
- Strong interpersonal skills and ability to work as part of an interdisciplinary team and autonomously
- Ability to work alternative hours and maintain a flexible work schedule
- Excellent organizational skills
- Proven problem solving skills
- Strong written and oral communication skills in English
- Willingness and ability to travel to the networks and adapt to work in different cultural and linguistic settings
- Flexibility, patience, and the ability to adapt and accommodate changing conditions on projects
